Course Description:

This intensive 3.5-day institute is designed to assist health profession faculty, students, and clinicians, whose native languages are from Asia, to write a publishable manuscript in English journals. Each participant who comes with an idea for a manuscript will have the opportunity to write that manuscript and have the writing critiqued and edited. SeonAe Yeo is a native of Japan and has developed a successful career in the American academic environment over the past 30 years. Elizabeth Tornquist has a long and highly successful career in supporting and mentoring health profession faculty and clinicians through the writing process. After that time participants may make additional editing requests to Ms. Tornquist for a fee.

This institute is designed to help scholars from Asian countries develop articles that excite and inspire readers. Each morning Dr. Yeo and Ms. Tornquist (video casting) will present content on the basics for successful publication and Dr. Yeo will discuss key issues specific to Asian scholars. Time will be provided each afternoon for writing or individual assistance/editing. Dr. Yeo will also moderate sessions for successful career development in United States for those who plan to apply for a graduate school. Ms. Tornquist will offer one manuscript edit between the end of the workshop and July 18, 2012 (included in registration fee). After that time participants may make additional editing requests to Ms. Tornquist for a fee.

Who Should Attend:

Health Profession faculty and practitioners, post-doctoral fellows, graduate students, and others who are interested in writing a manuscript suitable for publishing. This workshop is focused on people whose native languages are from Asia.
